Cliffe Castle

Museum

Cliffe Castle Museum is a former mansion house containing rooms furnished with original items and paintings, as well as natural history collections, fossils, art and much more!

The usual opening times are Tuesday-Friday 10am til 4pm and Saturday-Sunday 11am til 4 pm. The museum is also open on Bank Holiday Mondays.

Entry to Cliffe Castle Museum is free but we welcome 'Pay As You Feel' donations, suggested at £3.00 per person.





How to get here

Cliffe Castle Museum is located in Cliffe Castle Park, Keighley.

The museum and park is approximately 25 minutes walk from the railway station or 15 minutes walk from the bus station. Buses (for example Bradford to Skipton) pass the lower main gates.

The 903 bus service operates from Keighley Bus Station and serves Cliffe Castle on a limited basis.




If you are arriving by car from Skipton Road in Keighley, turn up Spring Gardens Lane and continue for a few minutes. There is a car park for Cliffe Castle Museum and Park located off Spring Gardens Lane.



It is signposted to turn right with a blue sign (see bottom left).

It is free to use the car park. The What Three Words location of the car park is button.going.save





Head through this way for the café, aviaries and the play area.



From the car park, head down the slope. If you are a Blue Badge Holder, there are 2 Blue Badge Parking Spaces down the driveway in front of the Museum.






When you arrive

The main entrance is a large wooden door underneath a stone porch. You'll notice a green and gold lamp in a flower bed outside. At reception they can provide a map to orientate you into the galleries.

The front door is up 3 steps. It is heavy and may need a good push to open it. If you are unable to open it, there is a brass doorbell to the left side of the door.



Inside the porch you'll find another set of smaller wooden doors and then you are inside the museum. If you would rather avoid the steps, there is a flat entrance to the museum through the Conservatory.







This is the main entrance hallway. Welcome to Cliffe Castle Museum! (see image above)

You may also use the conservatory as a picnic space (see image below).



You will be greeted by a member of our visitor services team. They wear green shirts and black jackets. All staff in the museum wear a blue lanyard (see image below).




If you have any questions or require assistance, please speak to a visitor assistant.

The Museum Shop is located near to the main entrance on your left.




There is a staircase to reach the first floor of the museum. We're sorry, but there is no lift.


